Affiliates	<ul> <li>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</li> <li>Our affiliates include companies with an Arvest name; and financial companies such as Security BankCard Center, Inc., Waco Title Company, Superior Finance Company and Central Mortgage Company</li> </ul>		
Nonaffiliates	<ul> <li>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</li> <li>Arvest Bank does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you</li> </ul>		
Joint marketing	<ul> <li>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</li> <li>Arvest Bank doesn't jointly market</li> </ul>
